Upcoming Bible Studies:

Good and Beautiful God by James Bryan Smith. "Falling in Love with the God Jesus Knows". We all have ideas we tell ourselves about God and how he works in our lives. Some are true--but many are false. These stories we tell ourselves determine who we are and how we live. In this study, we will examine what we believe to be true about God and how we can practice our faith to reflect what we believe. We will look at the God Jesus knew. "We will discover the narratives that Jesus lived by - to know the Lord he knew and the kingdom he proclaimed -- and to practice spiritual exercises that will help you grow in the knowledge of our good and beautiful God." In this 10 week study we will dive into the scripture and daily practices of our faith together! We will read a chapter each week together and try out one spiritual practice. Tuesdays from 10-11:30, October 1st - December 10th; Wednesdays from 7-8:30, October 2nd - December 11th. Neither Class will meet the week of Thanksgiving.
